INTERTEX GENERAL CONTRACTORS' PRESIDENT TO BE INDUCTED INTO THE CLAREMONT COLLEGE HALL OF FAME

VALENCIA, CA (October 11, 2010)— Intertex General Contractors' President Dale Donohoe will be inducted into the Claremont McKenna College Hall of Fame on October 23, 2010. The induction is based on a remarkable basketball career during his attendance at Claremont. Dale will be the 8th mens' basketball player to be inducted in the 52 year history of CMS athletics.

Gregg Popovich, who may you know as the successful coach of the San Antonio Spurs but who is also the former head coach of the Pomona-Pitzer Sagehens, remembered Dale as one of the best offensive players in the conference. He used the word "explosive" in his ability to put a lot of points on the board in a hurry. In his career at CMS, Dale scored 20 or more points 18 times while going over the 30-point mark twice at 32 and 34 points. It is worth noting that he played in the era before the 3-pointer existed.

Dale's induction is not just based on his remarkable contributions to CMS basketball. He is also a leader in his community. He is a business leader, in the sense that he is the epitome of the community business person who brings employment to the community and works within the
